4. EXHIBITORS TO PROVIDE THEIR OWN VASES, PLATES ETC.
5. NO EXHIBITS TO BE DRESSED IN THE HALL DUE TO LACK OF SPACE - (STAGING AREA PROVIDED)
6. PRIZE MONEY PAID OUT SUNDAY AT WAINGROVES COMMUNITY CENTRE
7. AWARDS WILL BE COLLECTED WITH PRIZE MONEY

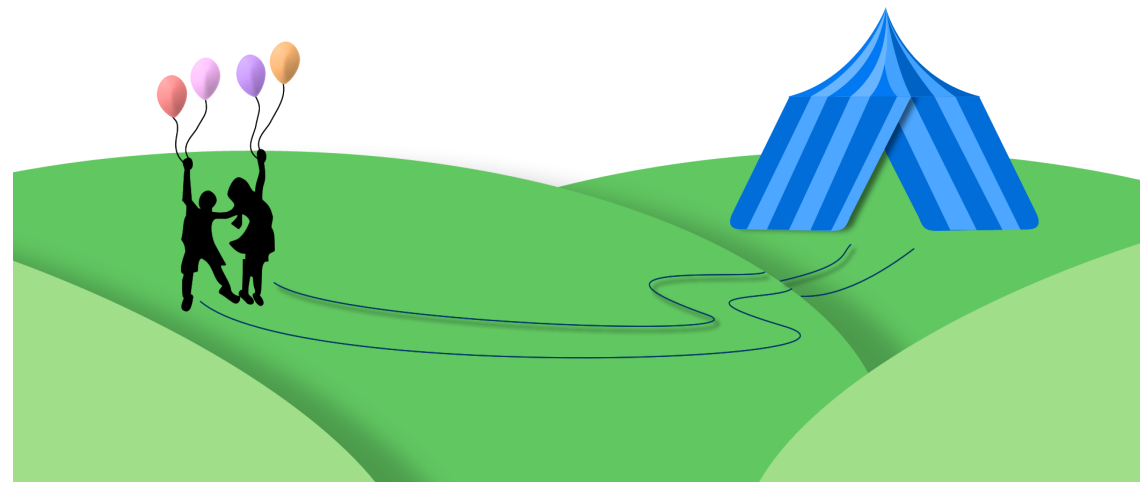
