

Recipe Challenge! - Gingerbread

Follow the recipe below and enter your gingerbread into our Horticultural Show - class number 72. The recipe challenge is a 'Bake off' style recipe with minimum instructions. We hope to bring you a different recipe each year

Ingredients:

225g plain flour
Pinch of salt
2x5ml spoon ground ginger
1x5ml spoon mixed spice
1x5ml spoon bicarbonate of soda
50g soft brown sugar
100g margarine
6oz black treacle
2oz golden syrup
150ml milk
2 eggs, beaten

Method

1. Heat oven to 150°C, Gas Mark 2. Prepare 18cm square tin.
2. Sieve together flour, salt, ginger, spice, bicarbonate of soda. Stir in sugar.
3. Melt margarine, treacle and syrup. Beat in milk. Allow to cool.
4. Add beaten eggs and mix. Stir treacle mix into the flour.
5. Pour into tin and bake for about 1 ¼ hours.





Horticultural Show Entry

How to enter:

Come along to Waingroves Community Centre on Saturday 9th September between 10am and 12:45pm with the things you would like to enter. Fill out the entry form on the right before you come along and bring it with you on the day to hand to the stewards on the door. It's one form per person (including children) and please note also that any under 18s will need a signature from a parent/guardian. Entry is 25p per exhibit (except children's classes which are free!). All children's entries receive a free chocolate bar (and yes... that's one bar per entry - enter 20 things and get 20 chocolate bars!!!)

You can enter as many classes as you like and as many things in each class as you like too. All classes are open to both Waingroves residents and non-residents alike (except class 37). And if you need more entry forms, they are available for download on our website www.waingrovesshow.com.

Prize money will be paid out on Sunday 10th September after 10am. Exhibits should be collected back again between 4:30pm and 5:15pm on Sunday 10th September. However, if you would like to leave any exhibits, these will be auctioned off for Show funds.



Horticultural Show Rules:

1. Entry fee 25p per exhibit - Except children's classes which are free.
2. All exhibits and thier staging items at the show remain at the risk of the exhibitor.
3. Exhibits to be removed between 4:30pm and 5:15 pm on the Sunday of the Show.*
4. Exhibitors to provide their own plates, vases, etc.
5. No exhibits to be dressed in the hall due to lack of space - a separate staging area is provided.
6. Prize money paid out Sunday of Show Weekend at Waingroves Community Centre.
7. Awards will be collected with prize money.
8. Points awarded: 1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point.
(In the event of a tie, the winner is based on the number of 1st Prizes. If number of 1st prizes is equal, award made based on number of 2nd prizes. In the event of a tie, trophy will be shared.)
9. All trophies, cups, plaques etc to be returned to the Show Entertainment or Schedule Secretary by 1st August next year.
10. Judges decision shall be final. (All entries judged by independant judges)
11. No exhibits staged in previous years to be staged again.
12. All classes open to residents and non-residents of Waingroves (except class 37)

Tips for Exhibiting

- Read the schedule carefully. Have you got the correct number of items, right size/weight and followed the instructions?
- Judges will be looking for uniform sizes and consistency in groups of items
- Items should be free from damage; produce and flowers should be fresh and make sure that baking is cooked, but not burnt!
- Think about how you stage your items - a black cloth under vegetables can make them pop; for cut flowers wrapping the stems in newspaper allows you to place the blooms evenly to show them off, present dressmaking on a hanger to see the garment

Waingroves Primary School

- The pupils in the school are articulate, well mannered and well behaved. Pupils' attitudes towards learning are positive and they concentrate on the work they are set by teachers, including when they are working independently.
- Pupils told me that behaviour is ordinarily good, but when it is not good as it could be the staff act quickly and fairly to apply school rules. As a consequence, bullying in all its forms is very rare and pupils feel safe in their school.
- Parents believe that their children make good progress. One parent commented " My children have been cared for and challenged everyday they have been at Waingroves. This is more than a school, it is a family."
- Governors are knowledgeable both about the many strengths of the school. They are rightly proud of the important role the school plays in the local community.
- Pupils told me how much they enjoy their learning as their class teachers 'make learning fun' and provide them with feedback for how they can improve their work.
- Groups of children, including the disadvantaged and those with SEND, are support well. Leaders identify pupils with SEND promptly.
- The headteacher has ensured that the school is a welcoming learning environment, where every child and pupil is respected and encouraged to learn.


